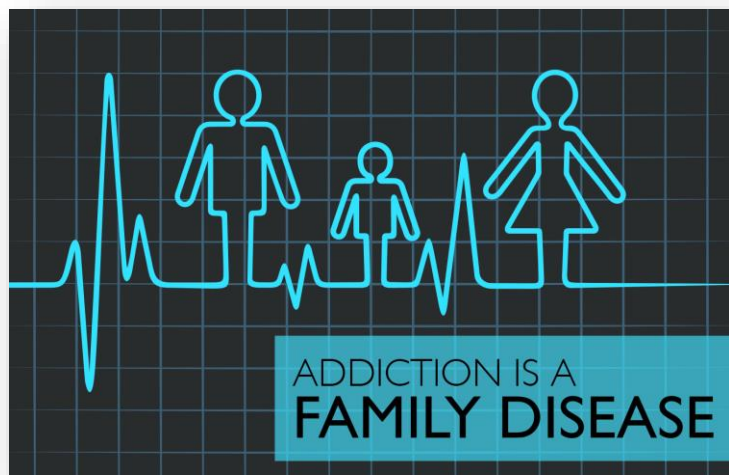

### SAY IT:

### KNOW IT:
